



Supplementary Nutrition Programme. (AVTM)

Project Goal: To provide nutritional supplementation support to the children suffering from acute malnutrition and bring them out of potential danger.

Project Overview:

Nutrition is the one of the major causes of disability and to prevent this, Asha Bhavan Centre has taken an initiative to serve the poor malnourished children through Supplementary Nutrition Project. It provides balanced food which contains high vitamin, protein and fat.

Project Objectives:

- To identify children suffering from acute malnutrition from the rural poor families within the project areas.
- Categorical screening of children depending on the degree of malnutrition.
- To provide nutritional support to children suffering from acute malnutrition.
- To aware the families and the community on nutrition and dietary habits.



Major Activities

- During that period we provided nutritious food to 309 children. There are 135 children with disabilities among them, who received support.

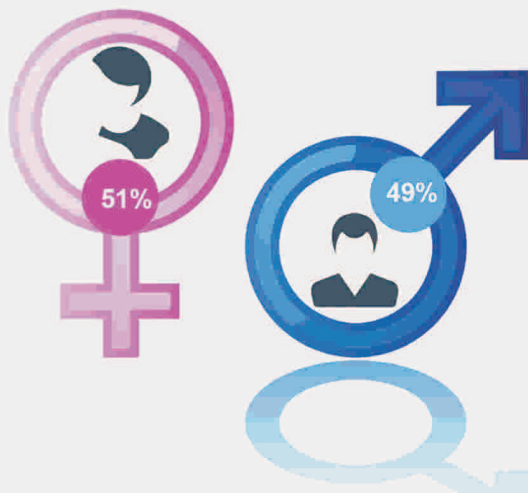
