



Established in 1999 in West Bengal, India, as a care centre for the children with disabilities, we have grown into an organization offering comprehensive integrated support and services for most vulnerable children through our initiatives in Dominique Lapierre Home for Children with Disabilities, Community Based Rehabilitation, Education and Training, Supplementary Education, Slum Development Programme, Dominique Lapierre Home for Mentally ill Women, Orthopedic Workshop, Community Health Department, Supplementary Nutrition for malnourished children, as well as Emergency Relief and Rehabilitation.

Dominique Lapierre Centre of Excellence for Disabled is our key initiative to provide residential cure and care services to the children with disabilities. The centre is an integrated support unit having residential facilities, vocational training centre, training workshops, outreach clinics, specialty clinics, school for children with special need and an orthopedic workshop. Situated on the Kolkata-Mumbai NH6 about 50 kms from Kolkata, the campus is a landmark in the area.

Dominique Lapierre Home for Children with Disabilities

Goal: Dream making for the children with disabilities.

Project Overview: The flagship initiative of Asha Bhavan Centre is a completely barrier free residential care and cure centre for 308 Children with Disabilities (Locomotors, Cerebral Palsy, Mental Retardation, Multiple Disability, Autism and Hearing Impaired) which provides therapeutic support, Activity of Daily Living Training, Nutritional support, Integrated and special educational support, medical services, Orthopedic aids and appliances support, co curricular activities, vocational training and recreational support to the children for their better life.

The highlights of this year are:

1 boarder with 80% disability appeared for Class- X Board Examination in the year 2013 under West Bengal Board of Secondary Education and achieved satisfactory result.



The children of Dominique Lapierre Home for Children with Disabilities (DLHCD) were invited to perform dance programme in a famous public Town Hall at Sanskriti Moncho of Burdwan District on 11th August 2012. A group of 9 children with disabilities performed well that was appreciated by all spectators. That programme was organized by Step Maker and Sizzler.

Dominique Lapierre Centre of Excellence for Disabled

Rotary Club Purbalok and New Ballygunge organized a sports meet for the special children at Sai Complex, Saltlake where 23 children with disabilities from Asha Bhavan Centre participated in different events and won prizes and medals. Moreover, 7 children with disabilities also participated in the sports meet organized by Paschimbanga Rajya Pratibandhi Sammilani at Sai complex. The children won prizes and medals in different events.



8 mentally retarded children participated in a drawing competition organized by Splash- an initiative of Concern India Foundation and were awarded with prizes and certificates for team sporting spirit.

Regular Parents' Meetings are organized to share the abilities and improvements of the children and to share the future expectation of the parents.



To improve the capability of the parents and to skill them on handling the children with disabilities we organize parents training programme where we transfer the knowledge and skills regarding different fundamental rehabilitation program and also teach them how to look after their children in a proper way.

One of our beneficiaries named Putul Maity, a vitamin deficiency child came to our centre 13 years ago for receiving residential care and cure support. Today she is 21 years old and working in our organization as a Data Entry Operator as well as serving the children with disabilities. Moreover, in this year she is felicitated with a certificate and a token sum of money by the Directorate of Mass Education Extension, Government of West Bengal and Ex- officio joint secretary to the Govt. of West Bengal for performing satisfactory result in West Bengal Council of Higher Secondary Examination, 2012.



Through therapeutic services we try to restore the abilities of the children with disabilities to achieve their optimum developmental milestone and make a child independent as much as possible.

Dominique Lapierre Centre of Excellence for Disabled

We have limited seats to keep the children with disabilities as a residential boarder and provide rehabilitation care and cure services in our Dominique Lapierre Home for children with Disabilities. For providing services to more children with disabilities we have been providing Day Care Services. We provide therapy and special education from 10 am to 4 pm for Monday to Friday.

Sulekha makes us proud

16 years old Sulekha Samanta is Post Polio residual paralyzed (80% disability) girl. She is a resident of Gutinagari village under Howrah district. But since last 13 years, Asha Bhavan Centre's residential home became her permanent shelter. She belongs to an economically downtrodden family where her father, the only earning member of the family is a daily labour and her mother is a housewife. Every moment of their life was full with lot of hardship. From dawn to dusk the father has to do labourious job to meet the family's basic need. In that situation, the birth of Sulekha was nothing impressive or joyful but an additional burden to them. The parents deemed that it was their previous birth's curse to have this disable girl as their daughter. Days were passing by, but she remained deprived to get required treatment. One day, through our outreach initiative, she came to our focus and her parents decided to admit her in our residential home. At that time she was very reserved and fully dependent for performing her daily living activities. Then we started her rehabilitation support along with formal and co-curriculum education for her overall development. Day by day her dependency level was diminishing with enhancing support and affectionate care of our therapeutic professionals. We always put our special emphasis to bring a child into the light of education and this girl was not out of track. This year she appeared in Madhyamik Board examination and successfully crossed over it's bank with a satisfactory result. She also completed her musical course on Vocal Classical and Vocal Rabindra Sangeet from Pracheen Kala Kendra. We the members of Asha Bhavan Centre, her parents and also the community people are very happy to celebrate that moment. That day's 5 years old little and calm Sulekha has grown up, a jovial girl, who won our heart by her sweet nature and beautiful singing. Even sitting on a wheel chair, she hosted our many inhouse programmes with great efficiency. We all are great fan of her singing as well as anchoring. Now she is ambitious to complete higher education and become a productive part of the family. We will feel immense proud to help such a talented girl through our Community Based Rehabilitation services for future progress and wish that she will reach the height of her dream.



Dominique Lapierre Home for Mentally ill Women

Goal: To provide complete rehabilitation service for the adult .

Project Overview: The home was set up in the year 2001 to provide residential care and cure support with counseling and vocational training to the mentally ill women.

The highlights of this year are:

Regular meetings are organized to share the health status and mental improvements of the women and to share the future expectation of the parents.



Enhancing the capability of the parents and to skill them on handling the women we organize parents Training programme where we transfer the knowledge and skills regarding different fundamental rehabilitation program and also teach them how to behave with them.

It is giving emphasis to counselling and other therapeutic supports to the patients for improving their mental health.

Bulti Mistry- A success story of mainstreaming

Love is always expected to bring a shining tomorrow in our lives. Sometimes it happens but not to all. Bulti is a 29 years old woman was admitted in our residential home as a patient of Schizo affective disorder. Dates back to her early childhood, we saw two vulnerable orphan little girls were forcedly get out from their own residence after sudden death of their parents. Since that time their maternal aunt looked after them. She is not financially sound. She works as a maidservant and her husband is a daily labor. When Bulti was in class-IX, had to left her study due to financial crisis. Situation compelled her to work in a tailoring shop to meet their basic need. In spite of few difficulties she was enjoying her profession. Few years later, her life took a new direction. She felt in love with a boy who was addicted on alcohol. Not only that he was also a debauchee. When Bulti got informed with the real fact, she became very shocked. She just wanted to turn herself out from this relation. But the boy did not make it happened. He started to harass and threatened in her way to tailoring shop. Situation reached at extreme level. She could not tolerate anymore. Gradually she became afraid and less interested in people, things, activities which once pleasurable. Her aggressive and agitated behaviour hampered the entire atmosphere of the family. When she was brought to our rehabilitation centre, her condition was very worse. She used to cry most of the time and tried to hide herself from others. Getting afraid often she beat the other inmates and threw dresses, objects etc., did not take enough food. Things took a U-turn within a year through regular treatment and counseling. We see immense change in her mental health. At present she is performing in the centre as a 'dance trainer to other inmates. During our programme we eagerly wait to see her dance performance. She is in search of a new avenue to explore her talent and lead a life with dignity. We all wish her best of luck.



Dominique Lapierre Orthopedic Workshop

Goal: Promote better mobility to make a person with Disabilities self- dependent.

Project Overview: Asha Bhavan Centre set up an Orthopedic Workshop in the year 2005 to manufacture and provide Mobility Aids and Appliances to the PWDs to improve their lives.


The highlights of this year are:

Reflection of PWDs' parents

My son Pallab is 11 years old. He is attending nearby village school as a student of class-VII. When he was 6 years old, he got injured while playing. He started complaining about his pain in left leg. We immediately brought him to Hospital. The doctors were tried a lot to save Pallab's leg, but due to severe infection, eventually they decided to amputate the wounded leg.

As Pallab lost his leg the scenario completely got changed. His friends and some neighbour used to torment him – they called him 'lame' or 'leg less creep'. Even pushed him to the ground when he tried to join them in playing. Such stigma, deprivation, made him very reluctant to go out.

One day through awareness camp of Asha Bhavan Centre we came to know about its initiatives and we got a ray of hope. At once we brought our Pallab in Asha Bhavan Centre to show the Technicians. The technicians thoroughly checked Pallab, took measurement and provided Transfemoral Prosthesis for my son's better mobility.

His artificial leg allows him to be independent. Now he can walk, run and do his daily living activities alone. His peers stopped calling him by mean names. They don't pushed him to the ground anymore. Above all, my son is happier and more confident.

He participates in all sorts of activities in the school. Teachers are very supportive to him. They help him in every way they can. The rehabilitation workers of Asha Bhavan Centre come to our home to monitor my son's status on a regular basis. As Pallab has grown, they have adjusted his artificial limb.

Now I put a tremendous emphasis on Pallab's education, so that he can achieve a meaningful life.



Vocational Training centre for PWDs

Goal: The goal of the livelihood support program for PWDs is to ensure that the PWDs youth including rural inherent talents in the age group of 14 onwards are assured of gainful employment and income that will help them to improve standard of their lives through producing high quality handicrafts.

Project Overview: Vocational Training is provided to the PWDs for their income generation and livelihood support.

The highlights of this year are:

The trainees of handmade paper unit doing a remarkable gradation in their production unit. All the supportive staff of the unit was boosted up and tried their level best to reach optimum point. The unit able to sale their product and help a little bit to the organization in such crisis situation. It is real happiness to all of us.



Due to some unavoidable circumstances we are unable to function candle making training cum production unit consistently. We are hopeful to recover the unexpected situation within a very short period.

The art and craft unit is also going with credential.

Supriya Dolui, an unbeatable fight of a 80% Woman with Disabilities

24 years old, Supriya is a post polio residual paralyzed (80% Disability) girl, took birth in a very poor family. Her both lower limb were affected since childhood. Hence, such physical oddness made her discriminated in the community as well as in the family. Her father, succumbed to illness even before her birth and mother was perennially ill. The whole family was completely dependent on her uncle for survival. This spirited, lively girl came to Asha Bhavan Centre in the year 2000. She comfortably blended with her peer group. Regular therapeutic support, counseling and compassionate care helped her to achieve better mobility and positive motivation towards life. She also found the opportunity to explore her co-curriculum talent. She learned tailoring and embroidery work under our vocational training initiative. In a couple of years, she mastered the skill that gave her identity and self-respect. Now she is a prime supportive member of her family, working in the textile unit of this respective department and she is doing special designed uniform for our home inmates. Her intense zeal and unbeatable attitude bring such establishment in her life, which is also a rich inspiration to the challenged children like her. We are very happy and proud to help her to step forward in life with full brisk.



Dominique Lapierre Community Health Centre

Goal: Create a healthy society for marginalised community.

Project Overview: Community Health Centres are functioning to provide medical treatment and consultation by general physician and specialized doctors. The unit is functioning in Kathila HQ premises as well as in Keoradanga, Amtala premises. Moreover, in Kathila premises we have x-ray facility and physiotherapy facility for the community people.

The highlights of this year are:

Medical treatment is essential to all patients irrespective of caste, creed, religion, age and gender but it is really a burden to the poor country people. Asha Bhavan Centre is providing them services for general and specialised consultation and free medicine. A huge number of beneficiaries were benefited in the year 2012-13 from the department. Mostly, the old age people, who are deprived in their family due to regular medication and check-up, are able to get sufficient support at their doorstep.



For the benefit of psychiatric patients two units are functioning with psychiatric doctor at Keoradanga (Dominique Lapierre Home for Mentally ill Women) and another at Kathila campus. 3,446 poor rural patients received medical consultation and free medicine.

We observe blood donation ceremony on the Foundation Day of our organisation on 22nd December 2012 within our main campus with much fanfare. ABC family members and other friends and relatives and community people donate invaluable blood for the sake to save life.

Supplementary Nutrition Programme

Goal: To provide nutritional supplementation support to the children suffering from acute malnutrition and bring them out of potential danger

Project Overview: To provide nutritious food to the malnourished children, the supplementary nutrition program is functioning since 2002.

The highlights of this year are:

To train the mothers' of malnourished children a one day orientation programme was organized in ABC campus. In that orientation programme 82 mothers actively participated in the programme. The morning session of the programme was facilitated by internal and external professional for sharing the information on the National Nutrition Intervention Programme and also shares their experience on achievable balanced diet to easy access cereals, vegetables and others food nutrition. In post lunch session the impact of the program echoed within the participants through sharing session.

New life of Bibhas

Bibhas Pramanik is a 10th month old brought to ABC when he was one month baby. He was significantly underweight baby then. At the time of his birth he lost his mother and such occurrence dragged his life in a black hole. In his family he was considered as unlucky child. Even his father, who should be more careful, attentive and loving to his motherless infant, just denied all his responsibilities. Such apathy and lack of proper care made his health deteriorated day by day. Near to this house there was a couple lived who are economically downtrodden. After the ten years of their marriage they could not beget a child. They found a great opportunity when they were offered to adopt the motherless child. The overall lay out of their lives got a massive change. But in spite of this happiness there was a matter of worry. Because when the child came to their house he was suffering from malnutrition. As we know if necessary action is not taken timely malnutrition may put a lifelong impact on a child. But it was very hard for this child's newly adopted father to provide him healthy and nutrients enriched food. The situation started to get a positive shape after getting the child's required nutritional support for nine months under our Supplementary Nutrition Programme. Like his parents we are also very happy for his improvement. The child is dearest to his parents. Their shelter is made with mud but their bonding focuses a concrete relationship.



Community Based Rehabilitation

Goal: Enhance the capacity of PWDs within the community to improve their socio economical condition and ensure their Human Rights.

Project Overview: The concept of CBR was initiated in the year 1999 in ASHA BHAVAN CENTRE with an aim to improve the socio economical condition and to ensure the Human Rights of the Persons with Disabilities. The main focus of our all activities for the person with disabilities is to promote opportunities, protect their human rights and respect their abilities. CBR team is working in the remote villages of Howrah, Purba & Paschim Medinipur, South 24 Pargana and partly in Kolkata Districts and in the coming financial year we wish to spread CBR approaches in four more districts that is Birbhum, Murshidabad, Jalpaiguri and Coochbehar of West Bengal.

The highlights of this year are:

Early intervention is a major component of the rehabilitation for the person with disabilities. Through early intervention we can make a proper rehabilitation plan for the optimum development of a children/persons with disabilities and also we can support the family for their emotional stability. So, to extend our services for the children/persons with disabilities in the remotest corner of the Districts in West Bengal we initially conducted 2 identification camps at Bishnupur village of Rampurhat II block in Birbhum and at Mathabhanga town of Mathabhanga I block in Coochbehar. Further, we have a plan to include Birbhum, Murshidabad, Jalpaiguri and Coochbehar Districts from the coming financial year to provide need based rehabilitation services to the children with disabilities through therapeutic intervention (physiotherapy, occupational therapy, sensory therapy, training on daily living activities etc.).



Community Based Rehabilitation



To sensitise the community regarding the causes and preventive measure of disability and disability rights we organized 26 awareness camps in the remote location of our project area. We are able to embroil CBOs, Local leaders and community key persons to take responsibilities for giving opportunities to the person with disabilities in those localities.

We conducted training programme for ASHA (Accredited Social Health Activist) health workers and some CBO leaders at Medinipur district where major objectives of the training is to sensitise the grass root level workers regarding various issues of disability and to develop their knowledge and skill to identify the child at risk and guide them to the proper rehabilitation services.



In our country many people are defecating hither and thither which is specially seen in the remotest areas. Due to poverty many people are unable to built proper toilet in their houses. So, to provide proper sanitation to the children with disabilities Asha Bhavan Centre have constructed barrier free toilets in the houses of the children with disabilities for their proper sanitation.

A simple means of aids and appliances can make a big change in the life of a person with disabilities, but it is difficult for a person with disabilities to get that as most of the service providers are in city. Asha Bhavan Centre considers the problem and stretched its hands with initiative like mobile orthopedic camps. Through those camps, we reached the remotest places of many districts for taking measurement & casting and distribute individual aids and appliances in their doorsteps.



Asha Bhavan Centre took initiative to offer aids and appliances and barrier free environment by using the local resources such as bamboo and wooden articles.

Parents is the best caregiver of a child with disability and in our sub centre programmes a child spend maximum his/her time in home with parents, therefore a parents/mother should be as much as capable to handle his/her child. To improve the capability we organize parents training programme where we transfer the knowledge and skills regarding different fundamental rehabilitation programme and also how correctly continue the rehabilitation programmes in home for the betterment of their children with disabilities.



Community Based Rehabilitation



By Social Support we provided various type of assistance to the person with disability and the parents/ family having a child with disabilities. The support include financial assistance for opening small business, shelter and toilets, medical emergency, vocational skill development training, medical support, material support for income generating activities, assistance for education, etc. Through these supports we try to make a person with disabilities economically independent and to uphold dignity, equity and self confidence in the society.

MSTC, Ltd a Government of India Enterprise helped us to develop a park named Physical Activity and Motion Development Facility for Children with Special Need. This playground with all its equipments will be a place where children, regardless of their abilities, can play and get opportunities to improve their physical, psychological and social skills.



Children with disabilities and their parents organized “get together meet” in different sub centres. On the day parents' themselves cooked food, play some games, share their views with each other in presence of rehabilitation professionals and enjoyed the whole day enthusiastically. The objective of the “get together meet” is not only to have amusement but also for building up friendly and helpful relationship among the guardians as well as the children with disabilities.

Indian well-wishers such as PSUs, corporate and individual donors came forward and stretch their supportive hands by sponsoring a significant number of children with disability through education, therapeutic support and medical intervention.



“Badhte Kadam 2012” is organised throughout the country for generating awareness and sensitizes citizens about the rights of persons with disability as enshrined in our constitution and as elaborated in the UN Convention on Rights of Person with Disabilities (UNCRPD). In collaboration with National Trust State Nodal Agency Centre, we have organised “Badhte Kadam” in our Kathila premises.

For economic sustainability of Person with Disabilities two numbers of beneficiaries of our Community Based Rehabilitation programme were placed to VRC (Vocational Rehabilitation Centre, a unit of Government of India) for job oriented training and placement in completion.

Community Based Rehabilitation



In the year 2012-2013 seven children with disabilities received higher education support through social help programme and we are pleased to share our success that one of our children completed Master Degree and four have completed Graduation.

Community Based Rehabilitation



Small help leads to big change

Achinta Modak, a 6 years old boy is affected with congenital deformities in both legs. He resides with his parents in small brick house that was partly damaged. The family is economically back ward but the parent is much responsive about their son's abilities and needs. In the very beginning the parents started his treatment for which they lost all their savings. But unfortunately there was not any significant improvement show in the child's abilities. At the age of 2 years Achinta unveiled by our programme officer through survey, a new hope rise for him and the family. They started to bring Achinta in Sankrail sub-centre and follow the rehabilitation programme in home. When he started to come under the intervention programme, he was unable to stand. It took four year but the scenario had changed, our rehabilitation support and guidance make Achinta a boy who not only walk but also run. Still the fortune did not favour the family, Achinta's father the one and only earning member worked as a daily labor in a local husking mill but severe physical illness lead him out of work. The livelihood of the family was then absolutely collapsed. The family's entire responsibility came upon Achinta's mother. She roamed here and there for help but all in vain. Then once again Asha Bhavan Centre extended its hand of cooperation. We involved her in our income generating programme by providing a sewing machine. This small support opened the door for them towards a new advent. Now they run the business smoothly which improve and stable the financial condition of the family. At the moment they put highly emphasis on their son's education in order to make him well educated and financially independent in life.



DL Education Project, a chain of Schools named Bodhoday Vidya Mandir

Goal: To provide comprehensive education and vocational support to the children of 3-15 years for marginalized community through formal, non- formal, special education method in rural education system.

Dominique Lapierre Education Project, a chain of schools named Bodhoday Vidya Mandir (Temple of enlightenment for knowledge)

Project Overview: Asha Bhavan Centre has taken an initiative to provide District Level Educational Support through formal and non-formal schools in rural Bengal.

Bodhoday Vidya Mandir, a chain of schools was started in the year 2004 with an aim to provide quality education to the rural poor children of different districts.

The highlights of this year are:

As per Government of West Bengal notification for affiliation of non- aided school, we have applied our all schools running under the chain of Dominique Lapierre Education Project named Bodhoday Vidya Mandir for recognition. At present, 2 schools (Bhalkundi and Sajnaberia) have already been recognized by the Government of West Bengal and other schools are in the pipeline.

Education and Training Division



The Education Department of the State Government provides 1980 sets of text books for the learner of BVM, a chain school under Dominique Lapierre Education Project for Deprived Children and 240 number of Hindi sets for Education Programme of Development of Slums project.

To identify the talents and nurture the dormant potentials of outgoing students of Class IV, Asha Bhavan Centre organised Talent Search Examination 2012 where 50 students of 10 Bodhoday Vidya Mandirs appeared and score good marks.



Annual sports meet and cultural meet is organised in each and every schools under Education Project to build a spirit of healthy competition within the children and also for entertainment and amusement of the children and their parents.

Quarterly Parents Teacher Meeting is organized in each and every school to discuss about the progress of children and preparation based on previous result.



Health camps were organized in all BVM schools, where different medical officers from Red Cross Society and other doctors from government hospital voluntarily came forward for health check up of the children.

Students of minority community received scholarship from Minority Grants Commission, Government of West Bengal.



One student of Bodhoday Vidya Mandir stood 2nd place of the toppers' list on Talent Search Examination conducted by National Science Society.

Education and Training Division

Government of West Bengal organised Talent Search Examination where 10 students of Marokhana Bodhoday Vidya Mandir appeared for the said examination and 4 of them scored first division marks.

When he studied in our school, he can create a position for him with his excellence and all the teachers are very hopeful with his success. This hope is come true when he could perform outstanding result in Madhyamik, 2013. He did well in the entire science subjects and scored above 89% marks. His family members are very happy to see their son's improvement. It would not be possible without the generous support of our teachers. Our team creates the lower education based of Firozeul and with the help of this, he got this outstanding success. He wants to be a teacher in future.



Supplementary Education Programme

Goal: To provide specialized coaching to children who are attending regular schools.

Project Overview: Supplementary Education Programme was started in the year 2004 where 31 coaching centres are functioning to provide educational support to the needy students of rural Bengal.

The highlights of this year are:

Previously, 30 supplementary education centres were functioning in Howrah District considering the proverb "Charity begins at Home". Through this education centre we are able to provide specialized coaching support to the school going children for preparing their regular home task and also mainstreaming the drop out children. Keeping in mind, the objectives of the project and felt need of the community on January 2013 we have inaugurated a new supplementary education centre at Kannyanagar, Amtala, South 24 Pgs for the children of sex workers. On January 2013 centre has been inaugurated by Francoise Recamier, representative of AVTM France.



In the beginning the supplementary education centre use to run at open roof under the sky using temple floor, youth club premises, community properties. But now we constructed three centres in our own land at Ganeshpur, Sitapur and Rajibpur where Francoise Recamier visited and inaugurated the centre for the well beings of the marginalized community.

Education and Training Division

Inter Annual Sports Meet and Cultural Programme were organized for the students of 31 supplementary education centre to reunite the students.



We have conducted Talent Search Examination, 2012 an Inter Coaching Merit Test Competition where 58 top learners from 31 coaching centre took part in the examination for enhancing their skills and updated knowledge.

Our teacher gives support to Sumon in his primary education in different steps of his life. He got an outstanding success. He wants to be a teacher in future.



Dominique Lapierre School of Excellence for Children with Special Need

Dominique Lapierre School of Excellence for Children with Special Need is a special school catering for students who have special educational needs due to severe learning difficulties, physical disabilities or behavioral problems. As a humanitarian integrated organisation working for the persons with disabilities we are trying our level best to serve education to the children with special need by establishing a completely barrier free special school. The school started functioning on 22nd September 2012 for Mentally Retarded and Hearing Impaired children. In Mental Retardation wings we have 6 classrooms of Pre Primary I, Pre primary II, Primary I, Primary II, Secondary and Pre Vocational and in Hearing Impaired wings we have 4 academic classrooms and one speech therapy and one audiometric room. Moreover, we have multi sensory room where we try to bring the sense of several organs of children with disabilities through sight, sound, touch, smell, self-motion and taste. In addition, MSTC Ltd a Government of India Enterprise, Association Lumilo Foundation, Swiss Organisation, All India Marwari Mahila Samity (a women association) and Shoppers Stop Limited, retail group's flagship business of department stores came forward and stretch their supportive hands to develop furniture and fixture of classrooms of the said school for the wellbeing of the children with special need.

Human Resource Development Program

Project Overview: Manpower development commonly human resource development is an integrated process that analyzes forecasts and projects an organisation's future manpower requirements. Asha Bhavan Centre organises Manpower development training in various aspects to upgrade its staff's professional skill.

The highlights of this year are:

Asha Bhavan Centre in joint venture with Kinesitherapeutes Du Monde, France have started 3 years Diploma course in Rehabilitation Therapist since October 2010 with 12 trainees from rural Bengal. Three years training program will be completed on October 2013.



One of our staff member from Orthopedic Workshop Department is continuing training on Orthotic in Lower Limb from Mobility India, Bangalore for one and half year's course. The training is sponsored by Asha Bengal, a Swiss organisation.

Education and Training Division

Skill development training is provided to 30 Caregivers for upgrading their skills to caring the children with disability and their whereabouts.



On 11th August 2012 we organized a one day training programme in collaboration with National Trust State Nodal agency centre at ABC, Keoradanga campus, 24 Pgs (S). 32 participants from NGOs and CBOs participated the programme.

In collaboration with IICP and Paul Hamlyn Foundation we organised 3 days (1st Aug to 3rd Aug, 2012) training programme for person with disabilities parents and professionals to enhance the quality of rehabilitation services in rural community. 35 numbers of parents and professionals participated the training. The training was organized at Asha Bhavan Centre Head Quarter.



On 28th & 29th September 2012, ABC organized a 2 days training programme for the Teachers' of Supplementary Education Project supported by AVTM, France. The training was organized at Rajibpur Board Primary School at Rajibpur, Howrah. The major objective of the training is to upgrade the teaching pedagogy of the teachers in Mathematics and English. 30 teachers from respective coaching centres participated the training which was facilitated by external facilitators.

To develop workforces and to enhance the skill of service providers, ABC in collaboration with Orthophonistes Du Monde, France organised short term Speech Therapy Training. Berenice De Champs and Baukje over De Linden International professional came to facilitate the training to 10 service providers.



From 5th - 7th December 2012, Annual Staff Review Meet and Planning Workshop was organized with senior members of different departments. The Programme Managers and Unit heads took part in discussion for drafting the next year plan.

Education and Training Division

An in-service Teachers' Training programme was organized from 21st March – 24th March 2013 where Programme Manager and other resource persons share their views regarding the new way of thinking about the significant changes of our attitude & also developing skill updated, knowledge for qualitative education through newly adopted course context of the Education Department of Government. A session on child rights was also discussed in the workshop.



Our organization boasts of its library comprising very rare copies of books for the professionals who are working in social sector specially in disability, education and primary health, NGO laws etc is shifted in our new school building premises for easy accessibility of all sorts of people. Books of the library are mostly supported by SAIL (Steel Authority of India), a government of India enterprise.

Development of Slums

Goal: To enhance the quality of life and obtain satisfaction standard of living through health & education services.

Project Overview: To uplift the health status, education and socio- economic condition of the slums, ABC with support from AVTM has taken an initiative to develop the slum areas, which are situated nearly to Howrah city at Tikiapara Banjara Bastee and the Belgachia Bhagar Bastee since 2009.

The highlights of this year are:

Through Community health centre we are able to provide medical consultation by general physician and also medicine at free of cost to the slum dwellers.



Immunizations, a critical component of global efforts to reduce childhood illness and death. They are among the most successful and cost-effective of all public health interventions, with the strong potential to reduce the burden of morbidity and mortality, particularly for children under 5 years of age. For this reason, immunization has been a cornerstone of national and international health initiatives. 73 children of those slum areas have been immunized for better health.

Development of Slums



In India due to poverty many people are unable to get balanced diet and nutritious food for proper development of their children. So, we have taken an initiative to provide supplementary nutritious food to the malnourished children.

Adolescent girls and women are under livelihood support programme through Vocational Training.



Awareness programme was organized on health seeking behavior such as pre natal, post natal and child immunization programme.


Management & Administration

Asha Bhavan centre is a Social Organization registered under West Bengal Societies Registration Act 1961. The highest decision making body is the Governing Body consisting of nine members. Day to day management of the programme is done by the Director of ABC in consultation with the Secretary and the President.

Sukeshi Barui, inspirational Founder and Chief Functionary of the Organization have been providing strategic leadership to the organization. Under her leadership, ABC has grown in stature over the years, reaching to the thousands of people in India.

The Programme Managers and Unit Heads are the top implementing body of the projects running in ABC by putting shape to the policies and strategic plans. They all are working as per advice of the Director. Team members are encouraged to improve their technical and management skills by participating in training workshops. Monthly and Quarterly meetings are conducted by the Unit Heads to share about the progress of the activities in presence of Director.

ABC Management is a team of Professionals, Social workers and Technical Resource persons, who work as a team to ensure that overall goal and objectives are achieved. As of now, there are 7% PWDs, 58% women staff, who are committed to the vision of the organization reaching to the thousands and thousands of people in India.



Future Projection

- ❖ Eagerly waiting for introducing Post Graduate Diploma in Special Education, recognized by Rehabilitation Council of India, GoI.
- ❖ Certificate course in Care Giver, recognized by Rehabilitation Council of India, GoI.
- ❖ Human Resource Development in Prosthetic and Orthotic
- ❖ To enhance the capability of person with disabilities through corrective surgery we need to establish an orthopedic clinic
- ❖ Introduce Community Based Rehabilitation services in Andaman & Nicobar Islands to serve the unfortunate tsunami affected person with disabilities
- ❖ Establishment of Integrated Child Protection Scheme, Government of India for rehabilitation services to children (girls) with special need
- ❖ To develop the rural economy we need to establish an Agricultural Training Centre as most of Indian (74%) depending on the same. Sharing knowledge and experience regarding new generation seeds and fertilizers with technical skills will certainly change the scenario of village.
